Discussion Points

About 8000 people in the town with different perspectives that we want to represent in a reasonable way.

There was some indication that money for the program might come out of the stabilization fund after all the bills are paid to pay for the program. However, other towns have paid for this program by raising taxes ½% to 2%. Exactly how this program will be funded will depend on our recommendation and the Select Board's Decision

Explanation of the benefits of this program to the town. That's one of the biggest things that we need to do right now. Why is it pro seniors and how can we help the other groups in town to make Unfortunatly, the cost of students to go to the Nashoba and Minuteman is quite high. That's something we need to research what the cost of students are.

There are some programs through the assessor's department, it's income dependent but can help people.

We need to put together all programs available locally statewide.

Actually it is tax profitable to have seniors stay in town as long as practical. This is because if the seniors sell their home, it would most likely be purchased by a family with children and the educational cost are quite high.

So we really want to make sure how to help seniors stay in town. But then again to help people of other groups stay in town as well.
