Dear members of the board,

Myself, as well as many others, were very surprised public comment was not allowed at the May 24th meeting. The total discussion was limited, however, one of the most prevalent issues was discussed, that being water. Mr. Ali informed the board that he had met with the water department. He estimates the project will use 27,000 gallons of water per day. Per Mr. Kevin Bartlett's letter to the board, " This would add to the towns daily water usage to an average of 27,066 gallons per day, which would put us over our withdrawal limits". It was very concerning that not one member

of the board was alarmed by this. Water pressure in town has been dwindling as we continue to grow. This project could cause major supply issues. A question that comes to mind is, will Mr. Ali supply funding to develop another supply of water?

The developer also mentioned how water will be supplied to this project. He stated they intend on bringing water through an easement from the Jones Crossing project. This easement is located on wetlands. Again no discussion among board members. The meetings occur once a month, it is vital public comment be allowed.
