**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
November 27, 2018**

Pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L., Chapter 131, Section 40 (Wetlands Protection Act), and the Lancaster Wetlands Protection Bylaw, the Lancaster Conservation Commission will hold a public hearing on **Tuesday, November 27, 2018 at 7:45 PM** in the Nashaway Meeting Room on the third floor of the Prescott Building, 701 Main Street, to consider the Request for Determination of Applicability filed by property owner Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) – Highway Division for proposed work within the 100-foot Buffer Zone to Bordering Vegetated Wetlands and 200-foot Riverfront Area within the eastbound and westbound travel lanes of Route 2 and associated State Highway Layout (SHLO).

The project entails:

Re-surfacing (milling of pavement) of Route 2, including travel lanes, shoulders, and on/off ramps; maintenance of drainage structures and pipes; replacement of guardrails and pavement markings; and related incidental work. The work also includes tree trimming, including selective removal of dead, dying or unsafe trees within the SHLO.
