There being a quorum present, Chairman Stevens called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM.

## Public Hearing – Notice of Intent; Schuffels Family Irrevocable Trust; 364 Bolton Road

Present: Steve Sears, David E. Ross Associates, Inc., representing Applicant

At 7:02 PM Chairman Stevens read aloud a Notice of Public Hearing thereby convening a public hearing to consider the Notice of Intent; Schuffels Family Irrevocable Trust; 364 Bolton Road.

Mr. Sears said a house exists that failed a Title V. They are proposing installation of a new system in compliance with Title V. According to Mr. Sears, there has been a mis-understanding and construction of the new system inadvertently started without approval of the Conservation Commission, but he had the work stopped pending issuance of the Order of Conditions. Agent Koonce reported he has visited the site, the erosion control barrier has been installed, and the work has not impacted any wetland resource areas.

Mr. Sears said the new system will stay at least fifty feet from the top bank, which is the mean annual high-water mark. There will be no removal of vegetation.

Agent Koonce expressed concern that the new system will be located entirely within the floodplain of the Nashua River, and asked whether the system might be damaged by a flood. Mr. Sears responded that modern septic systems are easily able to withstand inundation. He said that while some contents of the leach field will likely be released into the environment if flooded, neither it nor any other part of the system should be damaged in any way, and the system should continue to function normally during and after the flood event.

At 7:12 PM James Lavallee made a motion to close the hearing. Bonnie Mae Smith seconded the motion. No discussion. VOTE: 4-0-0.

### <u>Public Hearing (cont'd) – Abbreviated Notice of Resource Area Delineation; Crescent Builders, Inc.; Off</u> <u>Sterling Road (Assessor's Map 41, Lot 34B)</u>

Present: Iqbal Ali, Crescent Builders, Applicant Joyce Hastings, GLM Engineering Consultants Inc., representing Applicant.

Charles Caron, Caron Environmental Consulting, reviewed the wetland delineation at the above site. Two site reviews were conducted with Mr. Caron and Joyce Hastings from GLM Engineering Consultants. The following changes were made:

- Flags 18-28 to 18-31 were re-delineated, and expanded with Flags 18-600 to 18-609.
- Flag 18-38 was moved out 15'.
- Flag 18-54 was moved out 15'.
- There is a vegetated wetland (which appears bordering) just off the property near the southeast corner of the site. This area was delineated with Flags 18-501 to 18-504.
- Flag 18-63 was added to extend the delineation up to the property line.
- Flag A to C were added to extend the delineation up to the property line.
- Flag 18-126 was moved out 12'.
- Flag 18-125 was moved out 15'.
- Flag 18-143 was moved out 10'.

At 7:40pm Tom Christopher made a motion to close the hearing. Bonnie Mae Smith seconded the motion. No discussion. VOTE: 4-0-0.

At 7:42pm Tom Christopher mad a motion to approve the ANRAD as submitted to include Mr. Caron's letter. Bonnie Mae Smith seconded the motion. No discussion. VOTE: 4-0-0.
