- Express Yourself Songwriting; Laura Ramsey was unable to complete the project at RFK Action Corps as projected and will be returning the \$500.
- Museums To You (\$750). Reported just before our meeting that December 27, 2018 is the confirmed date.
- Nashoba Symphonic Band: requested Final Report Form numerous times (to the grant writer and the organization through email and phone messages 5/2, 8/10, 8/21, 10/2, 10/24). The Final Report was received by email right before this meeting.

Treasurer's Report

- As of November 1, 2018, there is \$762.33 in our account.

New Business: Local Initiative Arts Festival

- Denise Hurley lead a discussion proposing that the Lancaster Cultural Council put on an Art Festival in the future on the Common around the Gazebo. After the Council members discussed this idea, Denise

volunteered to take the lead and look into organizing the Art Festival. Denise would first look at the guide lines put forth by the Massachusetts Cultural Council and research other communities that have executed Arts Festivals. Local Initiative Arts Festival will be placed on the next meeting agenda.

Lancaster Cultural Council Priorities

The Lancaster Cultural Council's purpose is to promote and support local and regional Arts, Humanities, and Interpretive Sciences. The Council gathers input from the community every three years and develops funding priorities based on that feedback. Programs and activities that interest and benefit all ages are considered. Past funding has supported music events, plays, and enrichment programs both in our schools and in the community.

Priority is given to:

- Applications from local artists, organizations or groups
- Projects that demonstrate detailed planning including venue confirmation, date(s)
- Projects with complete and detailed budgets
- Projects or events that are free and / or low cost (for attendance or participation)
- Applications that show a match of cash or in kind services
- Proposals that address the diverse cultural needs of our community or support diverse forms of cultural activities
- Collaborative projects between cultural and community groups

In addition:

 A project that has received funding in the past from Lancaster Cultural Council must be updated or in some way altered such as incorporating new content, or relevant /current technology.

The Council reviewed the following 22 grant applications requesting a total of \$16,925. Lancaster Cultural Council has \$5600 available for 2019 grants (\$5100 grant allocation, \$500 returned funds from Express Yourself Songwriting/ project did not take place).
