## **Recreation Committee Updates – New Business**

#### Baseball/Softball (6:53)

- Revisited last meetings notes on scoreboard and miscellaneous improvements. 10K limit was approved in May 2019 meeting
- Matt Hourihan shared via email the multitude of volunteer hours he personally has been investing to maintain the three ball fields (Mill St, Thayer Baseball, Thayer Softball).
- Discussed master plan involved fields and that taking years to execute on. However, there are some tasks that can be completed with volunteer hour assistance or financial assistance

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## **Baseball/Softball (continued)**

- Committee discussed assisting Matt with tackling some of the items on the list and ways to help organize volunteer efforts and communicate volunteer needs to parents of players.
- The issues brought up highlighted the need for a town resource committed to maintenance of town land.
- Due to the large effort involved in organizing and implementing any of these initiatives, Ken, Dave, Katie, and Dan volunteered to assist Matt
- The following contains information regarding an email sent by Matt and paraphrased below

#### Field improvements

#### Introduction

- Interested parties are motivated to proceed with field improvements
- Other improvements might include
  - batting cages
  - scoreboards we need 2, to be fair (boys/girls), one to service softball field / one to service baseball field
  - bleachers
  - parking
  - snack shack

## *Needs / Next steps for Field Improvements to progress*

- Before proceeding with improvements, Matt would like to put a revised plan in place to present and gain consensus before going down disparate paths on specific elements
- To produce a plan, Matt has volunteered to sketch out improvements in CAD, but would need the latest CAD drawing of the area to proceed
- Matt will lay out some new elements relative to the existing infrastructure and that should help in minimizing any residual design costs

#### Groundskeeper

- Continue to need a groundskeeper or some type of part-time employee. Matt has been volunteering 10-15 hours a week for the past 5 weeks to maintain the 3 fields
- Maintenance includes
  - drag infields needs to be done after rain as sun will harden the clay and kids get hurt sliding
  - cut ballfields
  - fix fences
  - o trim weeds
- Parents are less and less available to do this and it needs to be done by someone.
- Simply getting someone to cut grass is not enough by itself.

## Trail Events (7:08)

- Stephen purchased supplies (butterfly nets, ponding nets, and insect bags) for use in future Lancaster Recreation guided programs. These supplies were paid for by the Freedom Trail's Hidden Gems stipend.
- Andrea will follow up regarding available dates for Fishing event.

## Thayer Park Update (Splash Pad) (7:17)

- More extensive update in May 2019 minutes were discussed
- Since then, the main update is that there are budget increases due to plumbing / water needs for splash pad, but those will be covered by grant money

## Town Beach (7:22)

- Note that there is a detailed list of items on the agenda
- As noted on the agenda regarding the updates, the interior painting has been completed and makes a big difference
- Other tasks to prepare for opening going as planned, with Joe and Andrea working together to prepare staff and facilities
- There already have been some purchases of swim lessons and beach passes
- Almost all positions hired, a candidate is identified for the final position
- Discussed beach toys for kids, possibly donations
- Beach Opening will be 6/22
- Inmates will be scheduled for a clean-up prior to opening
- 6/20 will be a staff meeting and clean up session
- Waterfront training scheduled for 6/18 for lifeguards, cost is \$100, and serves as a very good additional training certification for lifeguards

#### **New & Current Programming (7:35)**

  - First session successful
  - Between donated and purchases guitars, there will be 6 guitars (including 1 left-handed) \$500 approved last meeting
- Armando's Kid's Programming course Kids Code and Play Town Hall
  - Last session successful two 10-year-olds loved it and were a good age for the session.
     Parents were impressed with the program and wanted to spread the word to other parents.
     Used robots outside to exhibit programming capabilities.
  - Future classes to be planned

  - May host in community center in the afternoon with access to sinks
- Soccer Summer Camp scheduled week of Aug 5<sup>th</sup> with BEST FC

- Friends of Library Board Partner with fundraising (Melissa Carlson)
  - Wed 6/26 3-7, book sale and concert at 6:30
  - What can Rec provide to partner with event
  - Guitar instruction could take place at the library perhaps.
- Summer Concert series
- Horseshoe and Bocce Ball courts near gardens behind LCC for town use (idea presented by Jay Moody)
  - Horseshoe Pits Jay will help identify a space and interest and Rec Committee can help with purchasing materials and installing pits
- Youth and Adult Basketball owners are stepping down
  - Brian Hudak, Zack Gilmore, John Ramos, and a couple of other parents did respond to a request for volunteers
  - Bill Duggan will meet to help transition to new parents to form a board
  - The increased volunteer capacity and forming of a board should allow for a nice transition of the program
- Town Wide Yard Sale good traction thus far, will continue to advertise. Would like more tables on the green. Discussed outreach to folks for tables specifically to increase a presence in the town green. There are approximately 11 destinations for the map and 2 tables purchased so far.
