

Turning Memories into Memoir: Six-week course, with Mary Bonina



Mondays, March 25 – April 29, 2019 Thayer Memorial Library, 6:00 – 8:00 p.m.

This is a class geared toward memoir writing at every stage in the process, giving you some tools to continue working on your own. Learn through discussion and examination of examples by some of the best published memoirists. See how to get at truth in a story and make it come alive by using elements drawn from fiction-writing including detail and image, scene and dialogue, a sense of place and time, and character development. Participants will generate personal writing pieces through guided exercises. Other important prompts will help you mine your life to identify significant experiences that beg to be dealt with. By exploring life events that mattered for you, you can select moments that reveal the truth of shared human experience and enable readers to connect with your story. Finally, this class will also delve into ways to shape your story, choosing a structure that should be unique to the demands of your narrative.

Mary Bonina's first book of creative non-fiction was published in 2013 —My Father's Eyes: A Memoir—which tells the story of growing up and literally being her father's eyes, doing the seeing for him while he was gradually losing his sight from a genetic retina condition that eventually left him totally blind. Chapter selections appeared prior to book publication in Gulf Stream, Hanging Loose Magazine and in Zingology's anthology called Power. Excerpts from her memoir have earned her the designation of finalist (Goldfarb Fellowship, Virginia Center for the Creative Arts) and Honorable Mention (University of New Orleans Study Abroad Contest), in addition to several fellowships for artist residencies. "Our Mutual Landscape," Bonina's personal essay and memoir on the work of poet Christopher Gilbert and his 1970's community of poets in which she was active, appeared in the Worcester Review, an annual (2013). Bonina has been a Virginia Center for the Creative Arts fellow since 2002, when she was named first alternate for the Goldfarb Fellowship, based on the submission of early chapters of My Father's Eyes. She also received a Vermont Studio Center residency fellowship as well. She earned her M.F.A. from the Program for Writers at Warren Wilson College. Active in the Boston literary community, Bonina is a well-known reader, presenting literary programs and serving on the Board of Directors of the Writers' Room of Boston, where she also has studio space for her current work. But What's The Real Story?: When Plot Is Not Enough, A Workshop and Intensive, with Winona Wendth

A good reader, says critic Charles Baxter, is like a private investigator: He digs up pieces of evidence and starts putting them together to reveal the real story. A good writer is adept at putting those pieces where they will be found. This is subtext—story elements that reveal meaning in indirect ways. What allows a reader to zip through a story and recall only the plot is the absence of subtext; what makes a reader slog through a story is often a mismatch between plot and the language of description. Subtext, like plot, it is always at the service of the meaning of our stories or essays and can be developed in a number of ways.


In Part I, we will investigate short excerpts of good writing and practice using devices that can help our readers discover the meaning of our stories subtly but with great effect. Part I is free and open to the public.

Part II of this workshop is open to those who attended *But What's The Real Story*, on February 16, and want personalized guidance for their projects. We will share our own work in a modified workshop setting and revise with a mind toward subplot in staging, literary devices, tone, and characters.
