


### SUZANNE MAHLER: SPEAKER

Leave aboard a luxury motor coach to travel to the historic Griswold Inn (open since 1776) for a sumptuous three course lunch. Following lunch we travel to the scenic Essex River for a trip along the Ct. Coast by Steam Train and River Boat. Then it gets even better! We return to ride the Essex Steam Train & Riverboat's journey begins at the historic 1892 Essex Station for a narrated round-trip into the heart of the unspoiled Connecticut River Valley. The steam locomotive pulls vintage coaches through the quintessential New England towns of Deep River and Chester. A natural highlight is the undeveloped Selden Neck State Park, accessible only by boat. Essex Steam Train offers unique access to several coves and preserves, immersing passengers in an onboard eco-excursion. The train travels near the tidal wetlands of Pratt Cove and Chester Creek — bountiful, natural habitats for birds including Cormorants, Ducks, Swans, Greenland Geese, Blue Heron, Egrets, and Redwinged Blackbirds. In February and March, the majestic Bald Eagle is the star of the show when it migrates south to the Connecticut River Valley from Canada and Maine.

### Revitalize Your Brain, with Paula Castner

Studies reveal that writing, dancing, art, and listening to music improve brain function. Writing encourages the two hemispheres of the brain to work together, enhancing memory, productivity and stress relief. Dancing increases the brain's ability to manage balance, encourages neuroplasticity, and strengthens muscle memory. Art raises serotonin levels which affects mood, and the "wow" factor of appreciating art trains the brain to be more hopeful. Music boosts the brain's ability to learn and to lower and manage anxiety.

Come, join us for a four-week workshop to revitalize your brain. Participants will draw, dance, listen and sing to music, and journal. Open to all ages. Please wear comfortable clothing.

Paula Castner is the Chief Operating Officer for Seven Bridge Writers Collaborative as well as a freelance writer, playwright, drama director, writing workshop facilitator, baking coach, and professional administrator. Though she received her certification for writing children's literature, she writes in multiple genres. Her pieces have been published in a variety of venues, from parenting magazines, to newspapers, to online magazines, and have claimed first prize in several writing contests. Her play, A Fairy Tale Life? A Musical, with music by Canadian folk artist, Nancy Beaudette, was performed recently in Lancaster, Massachusetts. She is currently working on her second musical, Museum Follies, set in an art museum. In this workshop, you'll learn about the broad scope and various types of mystery stories. We'll work through the building blocks involved in creating a good framework for a book. Then we'll drill down to the finer details of the craft: why voice is critical, the importance of pace, dialogue, and planting clues, and how to create conflict and tension. We'll pull it all together by looking at developing a mystery from start to finish, creating a plan for completion, and then going beyond, to writing a series. Please bring your questions. A resource guide will be available.

Dale Phillips has published novels, story collections, non-fiction, and over 70 short stories. Stephen King was Dale's college writing teacher, and since that time, Dale has found time to appear on stage, television, in an independent feature film, and compete on Jeopardy (losing in a spectacular fashion). He co-wrote and acted in a short political satire film. He's traveled to all 50 states, Mexico, Canada, and through Europe.
