\* Cook Conservation Area (CCA): On Rte 70 in Lancaster two miles N of Rte 117 on the L or two miles S of Rte 2 on the R (parking on the west side of Rte 70 in small parking area or on the grass, not in the break down lane, to the side of the road).

\*\* Mary Rowlandson Capture Site: Hike begins at the Rowlandson Garrison Site following the Mary Rowlandson presentation in Lancaster Town Hall. From town green heading S on Main St. park in the small lot on the L side of the road immediately after the bridge over the Nashua River (before Bigelow Gardens). Across the street is the marker & field for the Garrison House.

\*\*\* Lancaster Town Forest: Meet at the Thayer Forest on Bull Hill Rd. Follow George Hill Rd. approx. 0.6 miles from Langen. Go R on Murphy. Go to end and turn L on Bull Hill Road. The trail is on the R in a few hundred feet.

### **Rain Barrel Facts**

The rain barrel is repurposed from a 60 gallon shipping drum that is 39" tall by 24" wide, 20 lbs. empty. The shipping drum is made from 3/16" polyethylene which is UV protected and BPA free. The barrel comes complete with overflow fittings, drain plug, screw on cover, and a threaded spigot with a choice of two ports to use with either a watering can or a garden hose. The rain barrel arrives with simple instructions for fast and easy installation. **Available Colors:** Forest Green, Earth Brown or Nantucket Gray.
