Rt117 will be closed Friday, the 12th,Saturday the 13th, and Sunday, the 14th, between Main Street Lancaster and 110/117 intersection, from 9am-9pm daily. The only traffic using the road will be cars going to Kalon Farms, or to park to attend the Bolton Fair, with traffic both

east and west ends at parking areas for the Fair, and vehicles are directed into lots.

The detour is the quickest way around the fairgrounds, and runs from Main Street, onto Centerbridge, to Rt110, and back to Rt117 (eastbound). If you are traveling westbound you'll be directed down Rt110 to Centerbridge to Main Street, and back to Rt117 again by the Middle School. Closing the road is a safety measure to ensure that the thousands of fair attendees can cross safely from the parking areas to the fairgrounds. Thank you for your understanding!


