Today what was once a family subsistence farm includes 23 acres of conserved landscape that is managed for wildlife habitat and passive recreation. Join fourth-generation owner Charlie McColough on tours of the pre-1800 English Style barn and wildlife habitat at 11:00am or 1:00pm. Registration requested for tours.

Learn how a community came together to permanently preserve this important natural resource. Also for viewing is the residence's hummingbird and butterfly garden along with the extensive use of native plants in the landscape.
