Lancaster Group Launches Bridge Replacement Project

The Lancaster Friends of the Nashua River (LFNR) are replacing two pedestrian trail bridges in the Cook Conservation Area off Route 70 in Lancaster. The project involves constructing two 32 foot steel supported bridges over streams along the Farnsworth Trail. Current bridges are simple wooden bridges in need of significant repair and slated for removal.

While the steel frames will be in place in the next few weeks, the work on the bridge decks and side rails will need to wait until spring. Portions of the Farnsworth trail in the Cook Area will be closed until the bridges are completed.
