## "1816: The Year Without a Summer"

In 1816, the year the citizens of Lancaster were constructing their fifth meeting-house, snow fell in June and there was a hard frost every month of the year. Prof. David Spanagel will explain how the massive 1815 eruption of Mount Tambora in Indonesia was felt halfway around the globe in our small New England town.

David I. Spanagel teaches History of Science and Technology at the Worcester Polytechnic Institute. A product of Harvard's History of Science program (Ph.D. 1996), he has been active in the History of the Earth Sciences Society over the past two decades, currently serving as that organization's Treasurer. He has also served as Steering Committee Chair of the Forum for the History of Science in America. David's first book, DeWitt Clinton & Amos Eaton: Geology and Power in Early New York (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2014) has received positive reviews in more than half a dozen scholarly history journals. Lancaster residents may also recognize David as their former Town Moderator (2008-2015).
