

## Fun Things to Do in Groton Sunday, May 31st

Attend the Keynote Presentation and select from the activities listed below to explore the rivers, wetlands, eskers, kames, drumlins, and kettle holes left behind by the glaciers, and learn about the history of Groton, both preand post-settlement. Unless otherwise indicated, activities are suitable for families with children. All activities are free except the canoeing/kayaking.

- 1. Morning Mountain Bike (Advanced) 7:45-12:00. Challenging ride past outcrops, wetlands and many geologic features.
- Morning Hike (Intermediate) 9:00-12:00.
   Experience many glacial remnants hiking from Town Forest to Town Hall.
- 3. Canoeing/Kayaking 9:30-6:30. Discounted rentals. Self-guided tours of the Nashua River.
- 4. Lunchtime 12:00-12:30. Have a bite to eat at any of the several establishments on Main St. (Rte. 119).

### 5th Annual Lancaster Nashua River Festival Saturday, June 20th 9:00 AM-4:00 PM



"Fixing Our Broken Democracy" traces the evolution of corporate power and the loss of our democracy through multimedia presentations and small group discussions.
