

On Saturday, June 20, Lancaster 4-H will be conducting a registration at the Nashua River Festival from 10:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. Lancaster 4-H is open to Lancaster residents K to grade 5 and from grades 6 -12 is open to the Nashoba district.

This program is perfect for children who are interested in hands-on activities and enjoy meeting new people. This program is available to girls and boys beginning in kindergarten and going through 18 years of age. Group sizes are kept small to ensure the best experience for program members. Children are grouped by grade level for regular group meetings which are scheduled on a bi-weekly basis. Activities involving animals are scheduled on a weekly basis. Program activities include; cooking, hiking, sewing, animal husbandry, public speaking, and camping.

Lancaster 4-H runs the poultry, beef and dairy shows at the Bolton Fair. This civic-minded group is always exploring new ways to help the community. Some of our activities include:

Arranging the Annual Tree Lighting, Repairing the 911 Courtyard at the Mary Rowlandson School, Arranging the annual Easter egg hunt, Planting a garden at the Mary Rowlandson School, and Competing in many local fairs throughout Massa-chusetts!

This registration is for the 2015-2016 school year. <u>A non-refundable fee of \$125.00 is required at the time of registration</u>. This fee includes: a \$50.00 charge implemented by the University of Massachusetts; a 4-H tee shirt; and \$75.00 dues for group activities and awards/pins earned by group participants during the year. A waiver form is available to cover the charge implemented by the University of Massachusetts. Parents are asked to volunteer in any way they can. A Cori will be required, please bring a copy of your license.

Studies show that 4-H members do better in school, are more motivated to help others, feel safe to try new things, achieve a sense of self-esteem, and develop lasting friendships.
