**Speaker**: Robert Adam, Preservationist will present his program, Divulging its Secrets: A fascinating presentation on the restoration of the Houghton Sprague Garrison House.

Robert Adam Preservation Services operates out of Shirley, MA. Robert retired from North Bennett Street School after 30 years. He was hired to work as a carpentry instructor to teach contemporary construction methods and subsequently became head of the department. During his tenure he proposed the school offer preservation training that would be unique in the field. Instead of a single site, Mr. Adam foresaw the opportunity to work on historic sites throughout New England and the Northeast.

Mr. Adam bought, moved and restored the Shaker Infirmary, which was removed from its location on the Old Union Turnpike in Lancaster. It is presently located off of Parker Road in Shirley.


