Officers of the Minuteman School Committee have finalized the warrant for a September 20th district-wide election that will decide on bonding for a new Minuteman High School. On August 1st, the officers approved an election warrant that had been prepared by the Minuteman School Administration in consultation with town clerks and boards of selectmen in the District's 16 member towns.

The special election, to be held **Tuesday**, **September 20**, **2016** from **12 noon to 8 p.m.**, was called by the Minuteman School Committee to determine whether District voters support or oppose bonding for a new school. ## **IS YOUR DOG NUMBER ONE?!**

The Town Clerk's Office will be holding a contest to name Lancaster's Number #1 Dog for the 2017 calendar year. Beginning September 15<sup>th</sup>, residents who license their dogs will have a chance to have their canine companion voted as Lancaster's Number #1 Dog. The 1<sup>st</sup> place winner will receive the #1 dog license for 2017 at no charge, and have their picture in the Clinton Item. Participants must send a favorite photo of their pet via email to "number1dog2017@lancasterma.net" by October 1<sup>st</sup>, or via mail by downloading the registration form from the Town Clerk's website at:

More than one dog per family may be entered. A valid rabies certificate must be available for any dog entered. After the initial entries have been logged, the Office of the Town Clerk will, by random drawing, narrow the field to five. Those five entries will be placed on a "ballot", and with the cooperation of Principal Sean O'Shea and the Staff of the Mary Rowlandson School, students in grades 1 through 5 will have the chance to "vote" for their favorite dog to become Lancaster's #1 Dog for the 2017 calendar year. **MBSR (Mindfulness-based Stress Reduction)** is an experiential learning program that engages the cultivation of mindfulness: a moment-by-moment, non-judgmental awareness of experience. Through group and individual practices (including meditation and yoga), discussions, and presentations, you will learn a variety approaches for integrating mindfulness into life. This 8-week course, originally developed by Jon Kabat-Zinn, helps us find inner resources for balance, wellness, and peace of mind.

**Gentle Mindful Yoga** introduces the practice of mindful movement, which is gentle and enlivening, to anyone who wishes to explore embodiment with awareness. In this class you will discover how to skillfully relate to yoga as healing and awakening method. You will learn basic yoga movements and postures and consider easy ways to integrate them into your life for deeper well-being and meaning. Each session concludes with a brief guided sitting meditation.

Sitting Meditation includes guided sitting, standing and walking mindfulness practices offered with reference to the Insight Meditation and MBSR traditions. Additionally, there is time for talks on the teachings and discussions about the practice. The emphasis is on learning to cultivate mindfulness, kindness and concentration. Sometimes a brief mindful movement period will be included.

About the Teacher: Éowyn Ahlstrom teaches MBSR and other mindfulness programs at the UMass Medical School's Center for Mindfulness, and yoga for retreats at the Insight Meditation Society, including the Forest Refuge. Éowyn first encountered the practice more than twenty years ago and has been an avid student of mindfulness practice ever since. She offers an integrated approach to developing well-being and independence, with focus on developing embodiment, awareness, calm and joy.
