Benefits

CHAPTER 115 Benefits: The Commonwealth is the only state in the Union that has made generous provisions by state law that provide veterans in need of EMERGENCY financial assistance with food, housing, clothing, employment, medical, and burial assistance.

Property Tax: There are a number of exemptions available to certain disabled veterans or their survivors.

<u>Sales and Excise Tax</u>: Certain disabled veterans are eligible for motor vehicle sales and excise tax exemptions.

State Annuity: There is a \$2,000 annuity available for 100% service connected disabled Veterans, parents of a son or daughter whose death occurred as a result of injury sustained or disease contracted during active service in time of war, insurrection, or to a spouse whose husband or wife died as a result of injury sustained or disease contracted during active service in time of war, insurrection.

Veterans' License Plates: A variety of veterans license plates are available through the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

Record Retention: The Leominster Department of Veterans' Services provides a repository of local records. Veterans are urged to provide copies of their discharge/separations papers to this office for safe keeping.

Educational Assistance: Veterans are eligible to attend state colleges/universities tuition free on a space available basis. Massachusetts National Guard Veterans who served in Iraq/Afghanistan are also eligible for free fees. Contact the financial office at the sate college/university.

Soldiers' Homes: The Soldiers' Homes provide a variety of services to veterans, such as, acute hospital, domiciliary, long-term care, physical and occupational therapy, and more. Please call (413) 532-9475 for Holyoke or (617) 884-5660 for Chelsea.

Benefits

Homeless Services: A network of Veteran Outreach Centers and housing facilities provide graduated levels of shelter, care, guidance, and counsel. Contact this office for additional information.

Massachusetts Veterans' Cemeteries: The Agawam and Winchendon State Cemeteries are now open and available to inter the Commonwealth's Veterans and their dependents. Additional information is available at this office.

VA National Cemetery: VA Massachusetts National Cemetery is located in Bourne on Cape Cod. For additional information contact the Cemetery at (508) 563-7113.

Public Housing: Elderly Veterans and their spouses (or widows/widowers of Veterans) are given preference for state-aided public housing through Leominster Housing Authority. For an application contact LHA at (978) 537-2861.

Employment: Veterans are given preference for employment. The Career Center at 100 Erdman Way, Leominster, MA also holds various workshops, and grant money is available for training/certification. For additional information contact the Career Center at (978) 534-1481.
